### New Councillor

The Town Council welcomed new Member Michael Joyce in June 2023. Cllr Joyce will represent the Central Ward for Amble.

### Local Transport Priorities

The Town Council has submitted its Local Transport Priorities to Northumberland County Council. These are: Priory Park Safer Crossing Point to enable all but especially children to safely cross the road when walking to school; parking restrictions around Leazes Street into Newburgh Street to Ladbroke Street due to the parking issues here, parking over the junction and blocking sight lines; and finally a safe crossing point at the bottom of The Wynd, which is desperately needed to help people across the road and get young people to school.
